The extant scheme of compulsory removal of import load containers to Off-Dock CFSs in KoDs is due to be reviewed by the competent authority on 01.10.2012 and decision for continuation of the scheme in its present form or otherwise is to be taken in terms of such review.

It is decided that pending the review of the scheme as aforesaid the current scheme should continue till further advice.
