## 5. PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

### A. Cargo Traffic:

- **Kolkata Port handled 29.969 million tonnes (mt) of traffic in April-September, 2018 vis-à-vis 27.716 mt in Apr-Sept'17 registering a growth of 8.13%, higher than the growth of 5.12% achieved by the Major Ports. HDC handled 21.049 mt in Apr-Sept'18 vis-à-vis 19.124 mt handled in Apr-Sept'17 recording a high growth of 10.07% while KDS handled 8.920 mt in Apr-Sept'18 vis-à-vis 8.592 mt handled in Apr-Sept'17, clocking a growth of 3.82%.**
- **KoPT registered growth in Apr-Sept'18** in respect of LPG, Other Liquid, Rock Phosphate, Limestone, Thermal Coal, Coking Coal, Other Coal/Coke, Iron & Steel, Timber, Salt, Cement Clinker, Dolomite, Gypsum, Container, etc.

### B. Container Traffic:

- **KoPT handled 4,27,709 TEUs in Apr-Sept'18 vis-à-vis 3,89,865 TEUs in Apr-Sept'17 registering 9.71% growth. KoPT ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> amongst Major Ports in terms of Container traffic in Apr-Sept'18.**
- **KDS handled 3,37,508 TEUs in Apr-Sept'18 vis-à-vis 3,20,214 TEUs in Apr-Sept'17 registering 5.40% growth. HDC handled 90,201 TEUs in Apr-Sept'18 vis-à-vis 69,651 TEUs in Apr-Sept'17 clocking a 29.50% growth.**

### C. Comparative Performance:

- **KoPT ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in Coking/Other Coal, 2<sup>nd</sup> in Other Liquids and 3<sup>rd</sup> in Container among Major Ports.**
- **KoPT ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in cargo handling among Indian Major Ports.**

### D. Ship Traffic:

- **In Apr-Sept'18, KoPT handled 1817 ships - the highest among Indian Major Ports.**

### E. Railway Traffic:

- **In Apr-Sept'18, KoPT handled rail-borne traffic of 13.93 mt. (KDS-2.91 mt & HDC-11.02 mt) against 12.46 mt. (KDS-2.77 mt & HDC-9.69) in Apr-Sept'17 registering a growth of 11.80%. In Apr-Sept'18, 695 trains were received and 709 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 2340 trains were received and 2330 were despatched.**

### F. Major Achievements:

- On 19.9.18 delegates of Nepal Scoping Mission met Chairman. The history of trade association, various benefits and incentives and also challenges in cargo movement between KoPT and Nepal were highlighted in the discourse.
- On 17.9.18 Chairman received the **Award of 'National Safety'** (Runners Up) for 2016 for 'On shore' & 'On board' categories from the Hon'ble Minister of State for Labour & Employment in New Delhi. **HDC received National Safety Award on 11 occasions earlier.**
- HDC achieved **highest container handling** in a single vessel when 1816 TEUs were exchanged by M.V. SSL Vishakapatnam between 9<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Sept'18 surpassing the previous high of 1766 TEUs by M.V. Sentosa Star during 15<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Aug'16.
- **Swachhata Pakhwada** was observed from 16<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> Sept'18, through various initiatives, viz. **walk to create awareness/Cleanliness Drive, Shramdan in the Port area, joint programme of KoPT and Tourism Directorate, KMCA, workshops, competitions, plays, paintings** with involvement of port users, stakeholders and tenants. The Pakhwada was ceremonially closed on 30<sup>th</sup> Sept'18 with a pledge to sustain the drive '**Swachhata Hi Seva**'.
- KoPT employees contributed 1 day's salary (Rs.83 lakh) to KCMDRF and relief materials (in containers) were transported free of cost from Kolkata Port to Cochin Port for Kerala flood victims.
- **Commemorative function was organized at HDC on 13.8.18 celebrating 50 years of cargo handling at Haldia** which commenced on 13.8.1968.
- Officials from M/s. DOHWA Engg. Co. Ltd. visited KoPT on 30<sup>th</sup> - 31<sup>st</sup> July18 for field study and meeting with the Chairman and senior officers to **explore possibilities of co-operation/investments between India and South Korea.**
- On 4.7.2018 the 2nd Pension Adalat was inaugurated by Chairman, KoPT. All the grievances placed by the pensioners were heard and many pending issues in individual cases were resolved.
- On 14<sup>th</sup> July'18, as a part of **India-ASEAN Media Exchange Programme**, 21 Journalists from different ASEAN countries visited Kolkata Port and deliberated upon issues of expansion/diversification of trade with ASEAN countries through Kolkata Port. The media persons and KoPT officers unanimously agreed to facilitate **bilateral trade.**
- On 20<sup>th</sup> June'18, the **1<sup>st</sup> Mini Cape vessel, M.V. Kishore** with 54,000 tonnes cargo arrived at Sagar Anchorage for the first time and unloading started with 2 recently installed Floating Cranes. Cargo operation at Floating Barge Jetty outside HDC lock gate commenced on 16<sup>th</sup> June'18 by discharging limestone.
- The **first ever midnight city tour** touching the important land and watermarks of the historic port-city of Kolkata, generating huge enthusiasm, was conducted on 16<sup>th</sup> June'18. The event was repeated on 1.10.18.
- As part of the joint initiative with CONCOR to start a **new route to Nepal for transit cargo** through India's gateway ports, the **first container train from NSD** of KDS, KoPT to Joghani, Nepal, was flagged off in April'18.
- 2234 vessels (1116 inward; 1118 outward) passed through Eden channel in Apr-Sept,'18 to / from Haldia.
