I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Handling of 2nd highest Parcel load of Dry Bulk Cargo inside impounded dock of HDC, SMP, Kolkata

On 19.11.2020, MV JAL KUMUD discharged 38,400 tonnes of Steam Coal at Berth No.14 (previously Berth No. 13), being the 2nd highest parcel load of dry bulk cargo discharged inside impounded dock of HDC, SMP, Kolkata. Earlier, the highest parcel load of dry bulk cargo discharged inside impounded dock of HDC, SMP, Kolkata, was 40,352 MT of Anthracite Coal A/c MV YK TAURUS at Berth No.9 (previously Berth No. 8) recorded on 23.08.2005.

II. CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 37.129 million tonnes (mt) of traffic during April- November 2020 vis-à-vis 41.091 mt during April- November 2019, registering a fall of 9.64% due to the serial Lockdowns of varying intensities, continuing in the aftermath of the outbreak of Pandemic COVID 19. Significantly, the fall in traffic (overall at SMP, Kolkata) which was around 23.74% till August'2020, has gradually narrowed down to 18.8% till September'2020 and further to 14.08% till October'2020, primarily due to robust traffic growths experienced by HDC during the intervening months. Iron Ore, Manganese Ore Iron & Steel Products, POL (Crude), LPG, Finished Fertiliser, etc. through HDC and Other Coal / Coke and Pulses through KDS have been showing a rising trend during April to November'2020.
- HDC handled 28.140 mt of cargo in April- November 2020 vis-à-vis 29.580 mt in April- November 2019 (4.87% decrease). During November 2020, HDC handled 4.559 MMT of cargo which is the 2nd highest handling (after 4.63 MMT achieved in January 2020) vis-à-vis 3.500 MMT in November 2019 recording an increase of 30.26% over the corresponding month of the previous fiscal. As a result, the decline of cargo at HDC which initially stood at 22.64%, during April to July 2020, had narrowed down to 4.87% for the period from April to November, 2020.

III. CONTAINER TRAFFIC :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 4,35,538 TEUs (KDS: 3,46,973 & HDC: 88,565) during April- November 2020 vis-à-vis 5,79,522 TEUs (KDS: 4,63,673 TEUs & HDC: 1,15,849 TEUs) during April- November 2019, recording a fall of 24.85%.

IV. COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE:

- SMP, Kolkata ranked 5th among Major Ports in cargo handling during April-November 2020.
- The Port ranked 1st in Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in Other Liquids among Major Ports.

V. SHIP TRAFFIC :

- During April- November 2020, 2015 ships (KDS: 655, HDC: 1360) called at SMP, Kolkata. 2802 vessels (1360 inward; 1352 outward) passed through Eden channel in April- November 2020 to / from Haldia.

VI. RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

- During April- November 2020, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 17.82 mt (KDS-2.97 mt & HDC-14.85 mt) against 18.88 mt (KDS-3.31 mt & HDC-15.57 mt) in April- November 2019. During April- November 2020, 698 trains were received and 711 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 2915 trains were received and 2900 were despatched.
