## **II CARGO THROUGHPUT :**

- SMP, Kolkata handled 9.208 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during Apr'22-May'22, vis-à-vis 9.185 mt during Apr'21-May'21, registering a increase of 0.25%.
- HDC handled 6.668 mt of cargo during Apr'22-May'22 vis-à-vis 6.894 mt during Apr'21-May'21 (a decrease of 3.28%). KDS handled 2.540 mt of cargo in Apr'22-May'22 vis-à-vis 2.291 mt during Apr'21-May'21 (an increase of 10.87%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of Finished Fertiliser, Raw materials of Fertiliser, Limestone, Manganese Ore , LPG , Pyroxenite , Other Coal / Coke, Paraxylene, Phosphoric Acid etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of POL Product ,Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Coking Coal, Pet Coke, Iron & Steel, Pulse, Container etc.during Apr'22-May 22, vis-à-vis similar period of last year.

## **III CONTAINER TRAFFIC :**

SMP, Kolkata handled 1,16,454 TEUs (KDS: 97,280 & HDC: 19, 174) during Apr'22-May'22 vis-à-vis 1,24,931 TEUs (KDS: 95,729& HDC: 29,202) during April-May'21, registering a decrease of 6.79 %. While KDS recorded a growth of 1.62%, HDC registered a decline of 34.34%, during Apr'22-May'22 vis-à-vis Apr'21-May'21, in handling of Containers (TEUs)

## **IV SHIP TRAFFIC:**

During Apr'22-May'22, 481 ships (KDS: 180, HDC: 301) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 511 ships (KDS: 173, HDC: 338) during Apr'21-May'21. 611 vessels (301 inward; 310 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22-May'22 to / from Haldia.

## **V COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :**

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2<sup>nd</sup> in handling of Other Liquids amongst Indian Major Ports during May 2022.

## **VI RAILWAY TRAFFIC :**

During Apr'22-May'22, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 5.525 mt (KDS-1.118 mt & HDC-4.407 mt) against 4.948 mt (KDS-0.828 mt & HDC-4.12 mt) in Apr'21-May'21 registering a growth of 11.66%. During Apr'22-May'22, 276 rakes were received and 281 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 1888 rakes were received and 1674 despatched during the same period .
