# SMP, Kolkata (erstwhile KoPT) Highlights of Achievements in November2022 I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

### PM GatiShaktiMultimodal Maritime Summit 2022

- On 23.11.2022, Shri Santanu Thakur, Union Minister of State, MoPSW attended the PM GatiShakti Multimodal Maritime Summit 2022 in Kolkata, organized to highlight the need of transformation in Maritime & Logistics Industry.The PM GatiShakti National Master Plan has ensured efficient logistics and cost reduction for the first and last mile connectivity.
- Chairman, SMPK opined that Multimodal connectivity will be a win-win situation for both India & Bangladesh.
- Various stakeholders at the Summit including Dy.Chairman(H)/Dy.Chairman(K) highlighted and shared notesontheachievements and challenges of various rail-road-waterways connectivity related issues for aggregation / dispersal of cargo routed through SMPK for its entire hinterland, including NER via the IBP route of Bangladesh.
- Speaking at PM Gati Shakti Multimodal Maritime Summit 2022, the Chief General Manager, NHAI, discussed various projects undertaken by them in West Bengal to address congestion-related issues and port connectivity to National Highways.

# **Trial Movement under ACMP**

• On 07.11.2022, under ACMP, trial movement of Indian cargo, originating from West Bengal via Chattogram& Mongla Ports with final destination to Tripura, Assam&Meghalaya was successfully carried out and was completed in advance.

• The four trial runs, which earlier started on 28.7.22 were envisaged for completion within four months. The traditional cargo used to get earlier transported through roads & rails. Now, a more economical alternative route via Chattogram & Mongla has been established for dispatch of cargo to states like Assam, Meghalaya and Tripura.

• Use of Chattogram and Mongla Ports in Bangladesh for movement of goods to and from North-Eastern region is a significant step in the Act East policy of GOI.

# Inspection of SMPK Railway yard by Sri P. Dansana, IRTS

# MoU signed with IOCL

An MoU was signed on 28.11.22 amongst HDC, SMP Kolkata,Indian Oil CorporationLtd&Haldia Refinery for construction, commissioning &operation of a Sewage Treatment Plant of 4.0 MLD capacity at Haldia at an estimated capital cost of Rs 17.53 crores with IOCL contributing Rs 8.45 crores. Executive Director, IOCL Haldia Refinery, Shri A.K.Mehera Dy. Chairman HDC,SMP Kolkata and other senior officials of both IOCL and HDC/SMPK were present on the occasion. The project will be executed in EPC mode with expected completion period of 18 months from award.

### II CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 41.60 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April 2022-November 2022, vis-àvis 37.159 mt during Apr'21-Nov'21, registering an increase of 11.95%.
- HDC handled 30.878 mt of cargo during Apr'22- Nov'22 vis-à-vis 27.191 mt during Apr'21- Nov'21 (an increase of 13.56%). KDS handled 10.721 mt of cargo in Apr'22- Nov'22 vis-à-vis 9.968 mt during Apr'21- Nov'21 (growth of 7.55%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Crude), LPG, Other Ore, Fly ash, Lime Stone, Coking Coal, Non Coking Coal, Petroleum Coke, Metallurgical Coke, Other Cargo, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Other Liquid, Fertiliser, Iron & Steel, Pulse, Coking Coal, Lime Stone etc. during April-22 to November-22 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

# III <u>CONTAINER TRAFFIC</u>:

SMP, Kolkata handled 4,49,661 TEUs (KDS:3,82,479 & HDC: 67,182) during Apr'22- Nov'22 vis-àvis 4,98,229 TEUs (KDS: 3,85,308 & HDC: 1,12,921) during Apr'21- Nov'21, a decline of 9.75%.

### IV <u>SHIP TRAFFIC</u>:

During Apr'22- Nov'22, 1996 ships (KDS: 717, HDC: 1,279) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 1948 ships (KDS: 660, HDC: 1288) in Apr'21- Nov'21. 2,562 vessels (1,279 inward; 1,283 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22- Nov'22 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 2,576 vessels (1,288 inward; 1,288 outward) during Apr'21- Nov'21.

### VCOMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April-November 2022. SMPK ranked 5th in Cargo handling amongst Indian Major Ports during April-November2022 vis-a-vis its 6th during April-November 2021.

### VI<u>RAILWAY TRAFFIC</u> :

- During Apr'22- Nov'22, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 23.278 million tonnes against 19.502 million tonnes in Apr'21- Nov'21, registering a growth of 19.36%. During Apr'22- Nov'22, 979 rakes were received and 1007 despatched at KDS; at HDC,4309 rakes were received and 4314 were dispatched during the same period.
- During Apr'22- Nov'22, HDC of SMPA handled Rail borne traffic of 19.380 million tonnes vis-àvis 15.813 million tonnes handled in corresponding period of previous year, registering a substantial growth of 22.56%. KDS of SMPA too registered a growth of 5.67% by handling Rail borne traffic of 3.898 million tonnes during Apr'22- Nov'22 vis-à-vis 3.689 million tonnes handled during Apr'21-Nov'21.
